NUS Maritime Mooting Team wins the 11th International Maritime Law Arbitration Moot

The NUS maritime mooting team emerged victorious at the 11th International Maritime Law Arbitration Moot (IMLAM). The team was crowned **overall winners** in the Grand Finals held at the Federal Court of Australia in Sydney, Australia, on 6 July 2010.

The members of the winning team are: Koh Rong En Timotheus (Third Year) Loh Ern-Yu Andrea (Third Year) Seng Yen Ping (Third Year) Dedi Affandi Bin Ahmad (Fourth Year)

The mooters in the finals were Andrea Loh and Seng Yen Ping, and they appeared before The Honourable Justice James Allsop (President, NSW Court of Appeal), The Honourable Justice Steven Rares (Federal Court of Australia) and Mr David Thomas (Minter Ellison Lawyers).

The team was also awarded **The Blake Dawson Prize** for the Winning Team in the Oral Rounds, **The Minter Ellison Prize** for the Highest Ranked team in the General Rounds.

Additionally, Timotheus Koh was awarded **The Middletons Prize** for being The Best Speaker in the General Rounds and Dedi Affandi Bin Ahmad won the **The Ron Salter Prize** for being The Best Speaker in the Final Rounds. Andrea Loh and Dedi Affandi Bin Ahmad were also awarded **Best Speaker in the General Rounds (Honourable Mention)**.

This is the third win for the NUS Team in this competition. The previous wins were in 2001 and 2002. Current team coach Mr Ian Teo (Partner, Rajah & Tann), was a member of the victorious NUS team in 2001.
