





Cultural Intelligence Workshop

With the increasing need to communicate and collaborate in multicultural working environments, it is crucial for business professionals to understand cross-cultural etiquette, adapt communication styles, and acknowledge the perspectives of co-workers or stakeholders who may view the world through different lenses.

This half-day workshop aims to increase students' awareness of their cross-cultural communication skills and to expose them to practical tips on how to communicate and collaborate effectively in culturally diverse teams in either an international law firm or the legal department of an MNC.

The topics to be covered in the workshop include:

- **Cultural Values** (Identify how culture influences relationships through a Cultural Values Framework)
- **Workplace Effectiveness** (Practice applying CQ to real-life scenarios to enhance relationships & outcomes)
