Tan Kiat Pheng Chief Prosecutor, Crime Division, Attorney-General's Chambers

Kiat Pheng graduated from the National University of Singapore's Faculty of Law in 1993. He completed his pupillage in the private sector before joining the Singapore Legal Service in 1994 as Assistant Director of the Legal Aid Bureau. He was then posted to the Insolvency and Public Trustee's Office in 1998 as Assistant Official Assignee, Assistant Official Receiver and Assistant Public Trustee. Kiat Pheng joined the Crime Division of the Attorney-General's Chambers in 2001 and was appointed as Deputy Chief Prosecutor of the Financial & Technology Crimes Division in 2015 before taking on the role of Chief Prosecutor of the Crime Division in 2019.

Kiat Pheng will give an overview of the structure and function of the Crime Division in the Attorney-General's Chambers and share his 30-year experience as a Legal Service Officer, in particular, a Deputy Public Prosecutor.
