About the Course

Many disputes arising out of contracts are about what the contract means. This, often difficult, question has provoked many cases but until recently was not much discussed in the books. The last fifteen years has seen a major change. Three excellent books have appeared (two English and one Australian) and there have been a number of very important decisions in the House of Lords/UK Supreme Court.

The lectures will consider what the current position is and highlight the most important changes. It will also consider another important and closely related question. Sometimes one of the parties seeks to argue that the written contract does not accurately reflect the agreement and sometimes the court will grant the remedy of Rectification to correct the error. Recent cases leave the scope of this remedy not wholly clear.

About the Course Convenor



Michael Furmston has been teaching law since 1957. He has held appointments in Birmingham, Belfast, Oxford, Bristol (where he was twice Dean and in between Pro-Vice-Chancellor). Michael came to Singapore for the first time in 1987 when he taught contract law at the NUS Law School, returning to NUS in 1999 to teach with the NUS Law Contract Law team.

He was the Founding Dean of the Law School at Singapore Management University. He has been a visiting professor in Belgium, Italy and Australia. He has been a Bencher of Gray's Inn since 1987 and was one of the successful counsel in the leading contract damages case of Ruxley v Forsyth. He has been the sole editor of Cheshire Fifoot and Furmston since 1976 and is the general editor of the Lexis Nexis Law of Contract (5th Edition, 2015). He has written books on commercial law and construction law and, most recently, on contract formation and Privity of Contract. He is co-author of "Contract Formation: Law and Practice" (2nd Edition, 2016) and "Privity of Contract" (2015), practitioner law publications by Oxford University Press.
