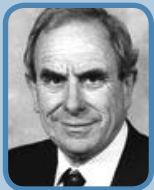

Conference Speakers



Lord Hoffmann
(Lord of Appeal in Ordinary, UK)
Lord Hoffmann was educated at Cape Town and Oxford Universities. He practised at the bar for many years, specialising in corporate and commercial law. He was appointed a Lord Justice of Appeal in 1992 and a Lord of Appeal in Ordinary in 1995.



Professor Hanoch Dagan
(Tel Aviv)
Professor Dagan is the Dean of the Faculty of Law at Tel Aviv University. He received an LL.M. and a J.S.D. from Yale Law School (where he held a Fulbright award) after receiving his LL.B. Summa Cum Laude from Tel Aviv University.



Professor Stephen R. Perry
(Penn Law)
Professor Perry is the John J. O'Brien Professor of Law and Professor of Philosophy, and the Director of the Institute for Law and Philosophy, at the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He received the degrees of B.A. and LL.B. from the University of Toronto, and the degrees of B.Phil. and D.Phil. from Oxford University.



Professor Emily Sherwin
(Cornell)

Professor Sherwin is a member of the faculty at Cornell and a member of the advisory committee for the ALI's Restatement (Third) of Restitution and Unjust Enrichment.



Professor Lionel Smith
(McGill)

Professor Smith conducted his doctoral research at Oxford under the supervision of the late Professor Peter Birks. He taught law at the University of Alberta and Oxford University before joining McGill University in 2000.



Dr Tang Hang Wu
(NUS)

Dr Tang is an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law, National University of Singapore, where he teaches and writes on the law of restitution, equity, trusts and property.



Professor Lusina Ho
(HKU)

Professor Ho teaches at the Faculty of Law, University of Hong Kong. Her research interests include: Obligations, Restitution, Trusts, Non-profit Law.



Professor Andrew Robertson
(Melbourne)

Professor Robertson joined the Faculty of Law at the University of Melbourne in 1999 and was appointed to a chair in 2006. His teaching and research interests are in the law and theory of obligations, particularly contractual and equitable obligations.



Associate Professor Alexander Loke Fay Hoong
(NUS)

Associate Professor Loke received his LL.B. (Hons) at NUS and his LL.M. at Columbia University. He teaches at NUS and his research interests lie in contract law, international business transactions, corporate finance and securities regulation.



Professor Tan Yock Lin
(NUS)

Professor Tan is a professor of law with varied research interests in the conflict of laws, the law of evidence, and equity and trusts.



Associate Professor Amirthalingam
(NUS)

Associate Professor Amirthalingam teaches at NUS. He was a graduate of the Australian National University where he began his teaching career in 1994.



Professor Mayo Moran
(Toronto)

Professor Moran is Dean of the Faculty of Law, University of Toronto. She has published in comparative constitutional law, private law, and legal and feminist theory.



Professor Prue Vines
(UNSW)

Professor Vines teaches in the School of Law at the University of New South Wales where she works in the areas of tort law and succession.



Professor Peter Benson
(Toronto)

Professor Benson joined the University of Toronto, Faculty of Law in 1998, where he became a full professor in 2000. He received law degrees from Harvard and the University of Toronto, as well as an M.Sc. in Politics from the London School of Economics and an undergraduate degree in Sociology from Harvard.



Mr Donal Nolan
(Oxford)

Mr Nolan is a Fellow and Tutor in Law at Worcester College, Oxford, and a CUF Lecturer in Law in the University of Oxford. His research interests lie in tort (especially negligence), contract and equitable estoppel.



Professor Graham Virgo
(Cambridge)

Professor Virgo teaches in English Law and is an Access Officer at the University of Cambridge. His research interests include criminal law and restitution.



Professor David Campbell
(Durham)

Professor Campbell is head of department at the Law School at Durham University. He was educated at Cardiff University, UK (BSc(Econ) 1980), the University of Michigan (LL.M. 1985), and the University of Edinburgh (PhD 1985).



Mr Richard Nolan
(Cambridge)

Mr Nolan is a Reader at the University of Cambridge. His research interests include: trusts (particularly express trusts, and equitable property), corporate law, commercial aspects of fiduciary duties, securities regulation and jurisprudence.



Professor Sarah Worthington
(LSE)

Professor Worthington is a Deputy Director for Research and External Relations and Professor of Law at the London School of Economics ("LSE"), and a practising barrister.



Ms Mindy Chen-Wishart
