ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Legislation now before parliament will transform the collection, use and disclosure of personal data in Singapore. This seminar will provide the context within which the new law should be understood, as well as discussing in detail the data covered, the entities affected, the conduct regulated, and the mechanisms for enforcement. Aimed at practitioners, it will also be of interest to those responsible for managing information flows in an increasingly interconnected world, as well as anyone seeking to understand the role of law in establishing Singapore as a "trusted node" on the information superhighway.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Professor Simon Chesterman is Dean of the National University of Singapore Faculty of Law. Educated in Melbourne, Beijing, Amsterdam, and Oxford, his teaching experience includes periods at the Universities of Melbourne, Oxford, Southampton, Columbia, and Sciences Po. From 2006-2011, he was Global Professor and Director of the New York University School of Law Singapore Programme. Prior to joining NYU, he was a Senior Associate at the International Peace Academy and Director of UN Relations at the International Crisis Group in New York. He has previously worked for the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs in Yugoslavia and interned at the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda. Professor Chesterman is the author or editor of twelve books, including *One Nation Under Surveillance* (OUP, 2011); *Law and Practice of the United Nations* (with Thomas M. Franck and David M. Malone, OUP, 2008); *You, The People* (OUP, 2004); and *Just War or Just Peace?* (OUP, 2001).

He is a recognized authority on international law, whose work has opened up new areas of research on conceptions of public authority - including the rules and institutions of global governance, state-building and post-conflict reconstruction, and the changing role of intelligence agencies.
