Climate injunctions in the intersection of torts, equity law and climate change litigation

Although rarely considered together, claims in climate litigation often exercise the right to prevent damage. Dr Marie-Louise Holle argues that tort and equity law play a crucial role in granting rights to those claiming their legal entitlements are infringed upon due to climate change. This will be illustrated with notable European climate cases, demonstrating how these legal frameworks are used by affected parties.

Dr Holle will discuss mainly European cases, in particular, the Swiss KlimaSeniorinnen, the Belgian Klimaatzaak, the German Neubauer, the French Affaire du Siècle/Notre affaire à tous, the Dutch Urgenda and high-profile Greenpeace cases.

Dr Holle will be in residence at NUS in September 2024, teaching Civil Law in a Global Perspective. An Associate Professor at Copenhagen Business School, Denmark, Holle specialises in torts, contracts, and climate litigation. She is a member of the Sabin Center for Climate Change Law Peer Review Network at Columbia University Law School, where she is in the corporate liability and climate change research group, and rapporteur for five jurisdictions (Madagascar, Monaco, Namibia, Seychelles, and the Vatican City State). Holle joined the editorial board of the Climate Law and has conducted numerous comparative and international law research proiects.
