Jolene is a member of the Academic Circle supporting the UN Special Rapporteur on the right to development (2024-2026) and Vice-Chair of the International Chamber of Commerce Global Environment and Energy Commission. She is also actively involved in global climate justice philanthropic initiatives.

Ailing is the Director of Legal & Regulatory (Transactions) at Temasek, where she manages strategic M&A and investment transactions.
