CBFL FUTURE OF BANKING & FINANCE SERIES Open Banking and Financial Inclusion: A New Wave of FinTech

On 15 October 2020, the CBFL hosted a webinar on 'Open Banking and Financial Inclusion: A New Wave of FinTech' with presentations by Dr Andreas Kokkinis, Senior Lecturer at the University of Birmingham and Dr Andrea Miglionico, Lecturer at the University of Reading. The webinar was attended by 47 participants from both the industry and academia.

The speakers started with an overview of the impact of digital technologies on financial services, particularly from the perspective of financial inclusion. Dr Miglionico then used two examples to illustrate how FinTech for payments and household lending could promote financial inclusion. He also elaborated on the new frontiers of open banking, which aims at enhancing financial data access, the new paradigm of financial inclusion. Dr Kokkinis then brought the audience through some examples of Blockchain technology in action, including Bitcoin, Libra and CBDCs. He discussed the promises and perils of cryptocurrency and called for appropriate public policy to address these. The speakers concluded that a new wave of FinTech initiatives is fundamental to ensure sustainable expansion of microfinance and efficient and inclusive delivery of technological innovations, and that tailored regulation is necessary to safeguard open data and the public interest.
