




Book Talk

Thursday, 24 February 2022, 5:00 – 6:00 PM Hong Kong Time via ZOOM




This book focuses on the building of a crypto economy as an alternative economic space and discusses how the crypto economy should be governed. The crypto economy is examined in its productive and financialised aspects, in order to distil the need for governance in this economic space. The author argues that it is imperative regulatory policy to develop the economic governance of the blockchain-based business model, in order to facilitate economic mobilisation and wealth creation. The regulatory framework should cater for a new and unique enterprise organisational law and the financing blockchain-based fund-raising and of development projects. Such a regulatory framework is crucially enabling in nature and consistent with the tenets of regulatory capitalism.
