These are a few of the questions to be discussed at the seminar, against the background of *Mediterranean Shipping Company SA v Glencore International AG* [2017] EWCA Civ 365; [2017] 2 Lloyd's Rep 186.

Dr Michiel Spanjaart was a Post-doctoral Fellow at NUS from August 2013 to July 2015 and he taught an intensive elective course on Multimodal Transport Law as a Visiting Professor in 2018. He obtained his LLB at the University of Utrecht in 1996 and his PhD at the Erasmus University, Rotterdam, in 2012. His thesis, *Vorderingsrechten uit cognossement* ('Title to sue under bills of lading'), was published as a book by Paris Uitgeverij in 2012. His most recent book on *Multimodal Transport Law* was published by Routledge in 2017. Dr Spanjaart teaches maritime law at the Erasmus University. He is an advocate with Trains & Co in Rotterdam and before that he was partner with Knepelhout & Korthals Advocaten, Padberg Spanjaart Advocaten and DLA Piper. His practice areas include trade, transport, and insurance.
