

MEWS' DIGEST OF ENGLISH CASE LAW, 1963. Edited by Peter Allsop.  
[London: Stevens. 1964. xxxiii + 599 pp. 3 gns.]

Mews' Digest of English Case Law is a series which needs no introduction. As with the previous volumes, the more important cases in a given year are digested and arranged according to subject matter. No important case decided in 1963 seems to have been left out in the present volume.

It is somewhat disappointing however to note that the list of "Words" which have been noted in the volume as judicially determined in 1963 is far from exhaustive. There are only thirty seven words in the list. A comparison with the list of "Words and Phrases" in the 1963 volumes of the Weekly Law Reports shows that there were many more words which were judicially determined in that year. Nevertheless, this volume does serve its purpose as a quick and useful reference guide to practitioners and students.

There is a "Table of Statutes Judicially Considered." This covers both the Imperial as well as the Statutes of the Dominions and Colonies. There is also an index of cases reported during the year 1961 and 1962 which have been either affirmed, upheld in part, approved, or reversed by the Courts in 1963. Added to this is an index of cases which have been followed, not followed, approved, overruled, questioned, explained, distinguished and commented on.
