THE ORGANISATION. By BURNETT, NEWELL, RUTHERFORD, TODD & WOODLEY. [London: Sweet & Maxwell. 1979]

This series is designed as an interdisciplinary text on the legal and economic framework of organisation. The first volume examines the structures in terms of objectives and accountability. The second volume examines the nature and needs of the markets in which commercial organisations operate. The third volume examines the interrelationship between resources (the factors of production) available to the organisation. The final volume examines the economic, political, legal and social environment within which organisations operate.

The interdisciplinary approach is welcome in that there is an attempt to integrate the economic and legal dimensions of organisations. This series does so in an admirably simple yet comprehensive manner. While the legal framework is meshed in with organisational structure—itself a valuable exercise—the approach goes beyond this. Volume 2 presents simple contract law against the backdrop of marketing techniques, and the economics of trade. The dangers in such an exercise are that an oversimplified treatment of either law or economics or worse both, may occur. To their credit, the authors have managed to avoid these dangers. The essential principles and cases are set out succinctly in a most readable style.
