

### APPLICATIONS FOR VISITING TEACHING APPOINTMENTS AY2024-25

We welcome applications for visitors to teach at NUS Law in Singapore, this time for our academic year 2024-25. The details appear below.

## Teaching commitments

The teaching schedule for all intensive courses taught by visiting professors is as follows:

- A total of **27 contact hours**, to be taught as 3-hour seminars, 3 times per week for 3 weeks.
- Classes are held on Monday, Wednesday and Friday each week. Classes on Mondays and Wednesdays run from 6:30pm to 9:30pm; classes on Fridays run from 2:30pm to 5:30pm.
- This schedule will only be changed where a class falls on a public holiday and a makeup class is required.

Visiting professors can choose from one of the following teaching periods:

- the last three weeks of August 2024 (12–30 August 2024).
- the first three weeks of September 2024 (2–20 September 2024).
- the last three weeks of January 2025 (13–31 January 2025).
- the first three weeks of February 2025 (3–21 February 2025).

Classes are taught in a face-to-face format. Visitors are, accordingly, expected to travel to Singapore and teach on campus, unless there are exceptional reasons preventing them from doing so.

#### Honorarium

An all-inclusive honorarium of about SGD 20,000 will be provided, out of which visitors will cover their own airfare and accommodation expenses.

### Other information

Courses offered by visiting professors should not duplicate or overlap significantly with courses taught at NUS Law in the same year. For an indication of our offerings, see the list of courses in AY2022–23 <a href="here">here</a>.

Visiting professors are expected to submit all reading materials (e.g. cases and articles) in electronic format (either .doc or .pdf format) for uploading to the intranet and dissemination to students. No printed materials will be distributed to students. Students are also not expected to purchase any books for these intensive courses.

Include in your email your course proposal and preferred teaching periods (nominating more than one period is helpful). Your course proposal should clearly detail learning outcomes and the content that will be covered in each seminar.
